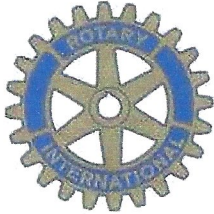

I'm glad to learn that you have made significant progress in the green technology arena since before 1992, when you first visited my Washington offices.



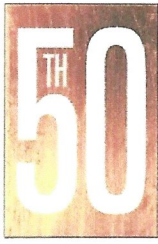

I have to be in Abilene, Texas for a kickoff meeting for our project with Siemens and Dyess AFB on Wednesday and Thursday and will have to return to Houston Tuesday afternoon after my 11:00 presentation. See below for the details of the project. Per this release, the base has signed two work orders, totaling \$ 39 MM to have Siemens build a waste to energy plant and a second ice plant loop. We will be building a 6 MW WOWGen power plant. The project will gasify MSW supplied by the city of Abilene and the gasifier exhaust heat (around 2000 F) will be sent to us to produce power – we will also be responsible for the flue gas cleaning if required. 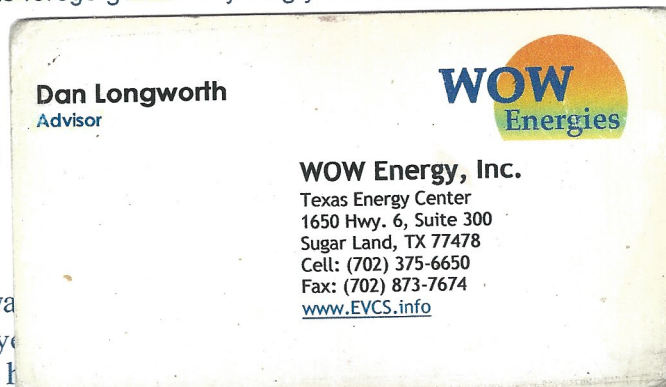

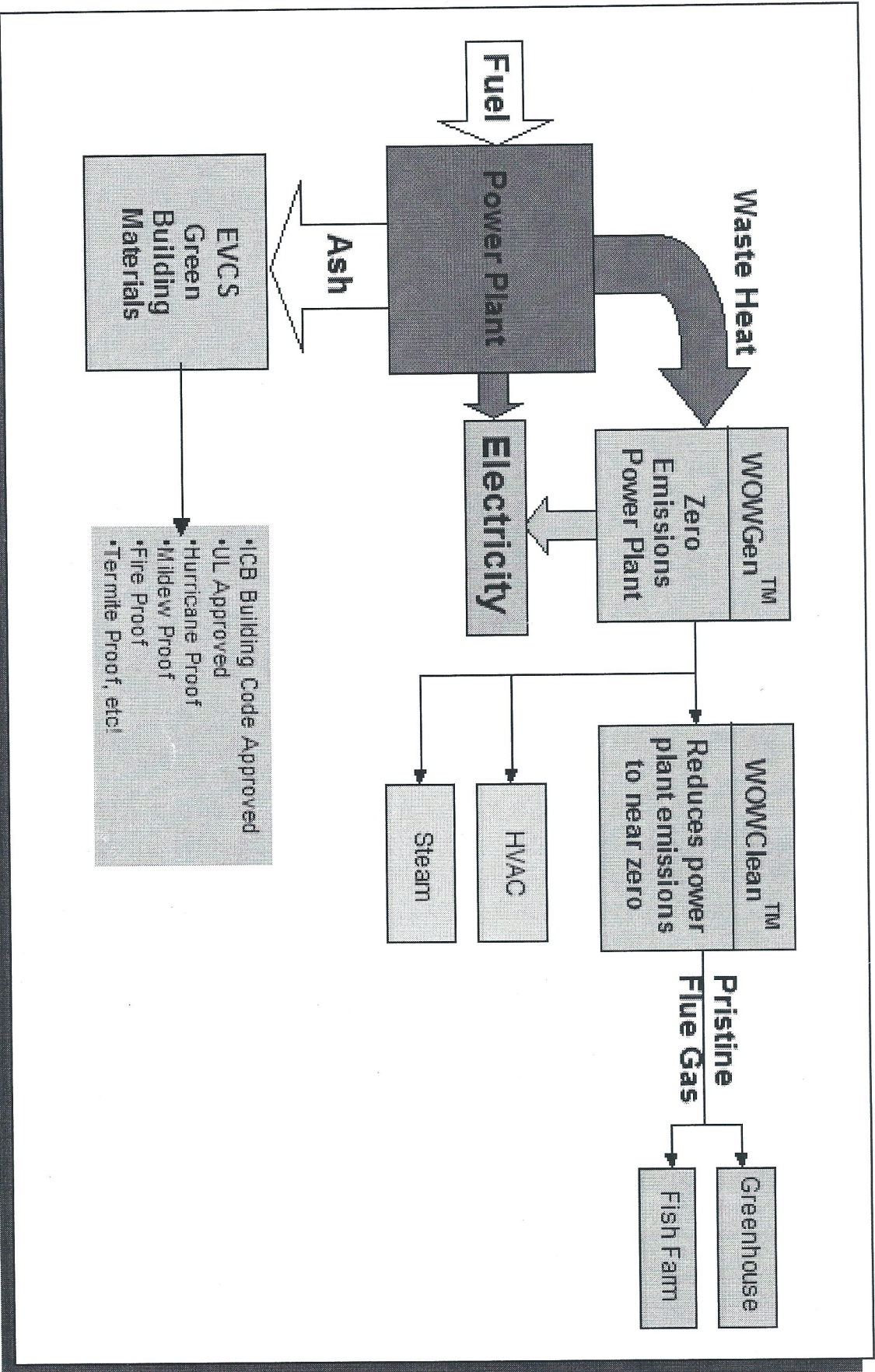
"Dyess AFB is a leader in employing energy efficiency technologies and in the procurement of renewable energy," Karsner said of the base. "Dyess is setting an example for the Air Force and for the military in general, about to effect ways to minimize energy supply and enhance our national security mission."

The renewable energy successes at Dyess included wind energy, passive solar, and biomass. According to the release, Dyess AFB was the first entity in the U.S. to use 100% renewable electricity at a single site. Its supply contract provides 100% wind-generated electricity, which makes all of the base's electrical power pollution free. The Dyess purchase resulted in approximately 75 million kilowatt hours (kWh) of wind energy generated annually, which represented more than 20% of the entire Federal government's renewable power at that time.

In some facilities, Dyess has installed 476 natural day-lighting fixtures in high bay facilities, which

Thank you for your time on the phone Friday afternoon. As always, it is a pleasure to discuss your Overton WOW-CRETE project. I have reviewed the business plan and attachments you have provided. I believe this information is sufficient to begin "shopping" your transaction to qualified lenders.

As you know, the USDA-Rural Development Loan Guarantee Program provides approved lenders an 80% guarantee on loans up to \$5 million, 70% on loans between \$5 million to \$10 million, and 60% guarantees on loan greater than \$10 million. The guarantees are to encourage the financing of rural businesses to create and retain jobs and to improve the economic and environmental climate of rural communities. The guaranteed portion of the loan is protected against loss by the Federal Government. The lender may sell the guaranteed portion of the loan in the secondary market. Also, the guaranteed portion of the loan does not count against the lenders lending limits or risk weighted capital.

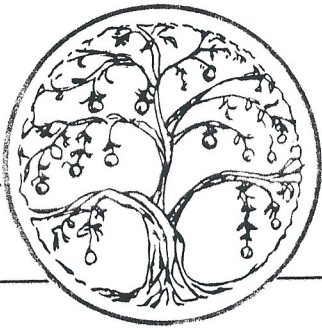

Dear Dan:

Thanks for your nice letter of March 30th. I am quite please that little Diana has done well. We are still very actively involved in taking care of children from Mexico. We continue to run a large outreach clinic in Tijuana and another one in Mexicalli, and are in the process of training one of the senior peditricians from the D.I.F. Hospital in Tijuana as a peditric cardiologist to assist us in the care of the patients that we don't get across the border.

We have worked with UCSD and to some extent, Children's Hospital and have gotten 2-3 children per year through heart surgery and have also had some partial funding for some of them from Variety International. We have never had a large fundraiser of the type that we discussed. The Mexican Children's Heart Fund still exists as a tax-deductible effort within the University of California Foundation. It is now called the "International Children's Fund", since we have from time to time used the fund to take care children from the Western-Pacific basin.

I would still be quite happy to have your assistance in underwriting or planning a large fundraiser in San Diego. We would also be quite happy to accept in the name of the name of the International Children's Heart Fund, a donation between \$5 - 10,000 which would assist us in underwriting the care of another Mexican child. We have a variety of ways to treat heart disease using catheters instead of surgery and can often, with substantially less cost, help some of these Mexican children a lot. We are actually planning to close a large intercirculatory communication in a Mexican child using a catheter-tip device next week and expect that this will improve her substantially without the need for open heart surgery.

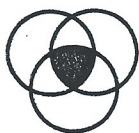

A client and friend of mine, Dan Longworth, is the president of a company called Coalplex International, Inc. (Coalplex). This company is in the electric generation business utilizing a clean coal technology.

Coalplex has acquired a site in Carbon County, Utah where it proposes to build an 80MW coal-fired generation plant along with a coal reclamation, purification and pelletizing facility. Dan believes he can sell 45MW of this capacity to Nevada Power. He would like to meet with you in Portland during the week of March 13, 1995 to discuss a possible displacement agreement with PacifiCorp to wheel Coalplex Power, using your transmission lines, down to Nevada Power's service area. Perhaps your Arizona subsidiary might be interested in some of the remaining generation capacity?
